UPDATES:	NPAT Timeline, Priorities - Still planning on ending after the March meeting, which means we'll have two meetings after today. Priorities will be Member Organization Presentations and working toward Strategic Plan goals. The Food Waste Prevention, Recovery, and Redistribution Taskforce (FWPRRT) will continue to meet monthly (3rd Wed of month), and the Mammoth Unified School District will continue school wellness committee meetings. Healthy Food Access - Per the CDSS website: CalFresh benefits are delayed due to the federal government shutdown. Recipients can continue using their existing CalFresh benefits on their EBT cards as usual. Due to recent court rulings, funding will be available to provide at least some CalFresh benefits for November. At this time, the amount of benefits or when they will be added to EBT cards is unknown, as the state is still waiting for instructions from the federal government. Jenna sent flyers detailing food distributions in Mono County for the month of November. These are available in English and Spanish. Please distribute to your networks. 	The Town of Mammoth Lakes and Mono County donated \$200,000 to provide grocery gift cards for prequalified EBT participants. ESFF gleaned fruit, most of which was donated to IMACA and other local organizations, and some is sold at weekly markets at a reduced rate. There is less to glean now, but they'll continue to glean what's available. They're looking into a potential winter produce program with Community Alliance for Family Farmers (CAFF) to secure additional produce deliveries. Larry to follow up with Dustin			

	regarding citrus and other produce availability at Lindcove Research and Extension Station for potential food distribution.		
	MUSD is holding a food drive, with tomorrow as the final drop-off day. Collection sites include MES, MMS, and Grocery Outlet in Mammoth. Donations should be non-perishable items, with preferred items including peanut butter, canned goods, canned beans, whole grain pasta, and rice.		
	IMACA is also conducting a holiday food drive, which will continue into January. Anyone can stop by the Bishop IMACA location between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday-Friday to pick up food. Emergency boxes have ~100 lbs of food, including canned foods, meat, produce, and bread. Sal at the Sawyer has volunteered in the past to pick up emergency food from the Bishop IMACA for Mammoth individuals if resources are needed. Cerro Coso may also be able to transport food to Mammoth. The number of participants at IMACA food distributions has recently declined, particularly in Mammoth. Any leftover produce is being given to the Sawyer. Fifty Thanksgiving boxes will be donated in Mammoth, with deliveries scheduled for 1 p.m. on November 24 at St. Joseph's Church.		
	Lara mentioned that First 5 gives \$25 gift cards and diapers to parents with children under 5 when they stop by their office and sign up for home visit services.		
	Sarah and Dennis at Bishop Grocery Outlet may be able to donate to those in need.		
	Cerro Coso's Basic Needs program offers gas cards and food for students. An enrollment event will be held on November 12 in Bishop. The college can also hold a food donation bin there if requested.
